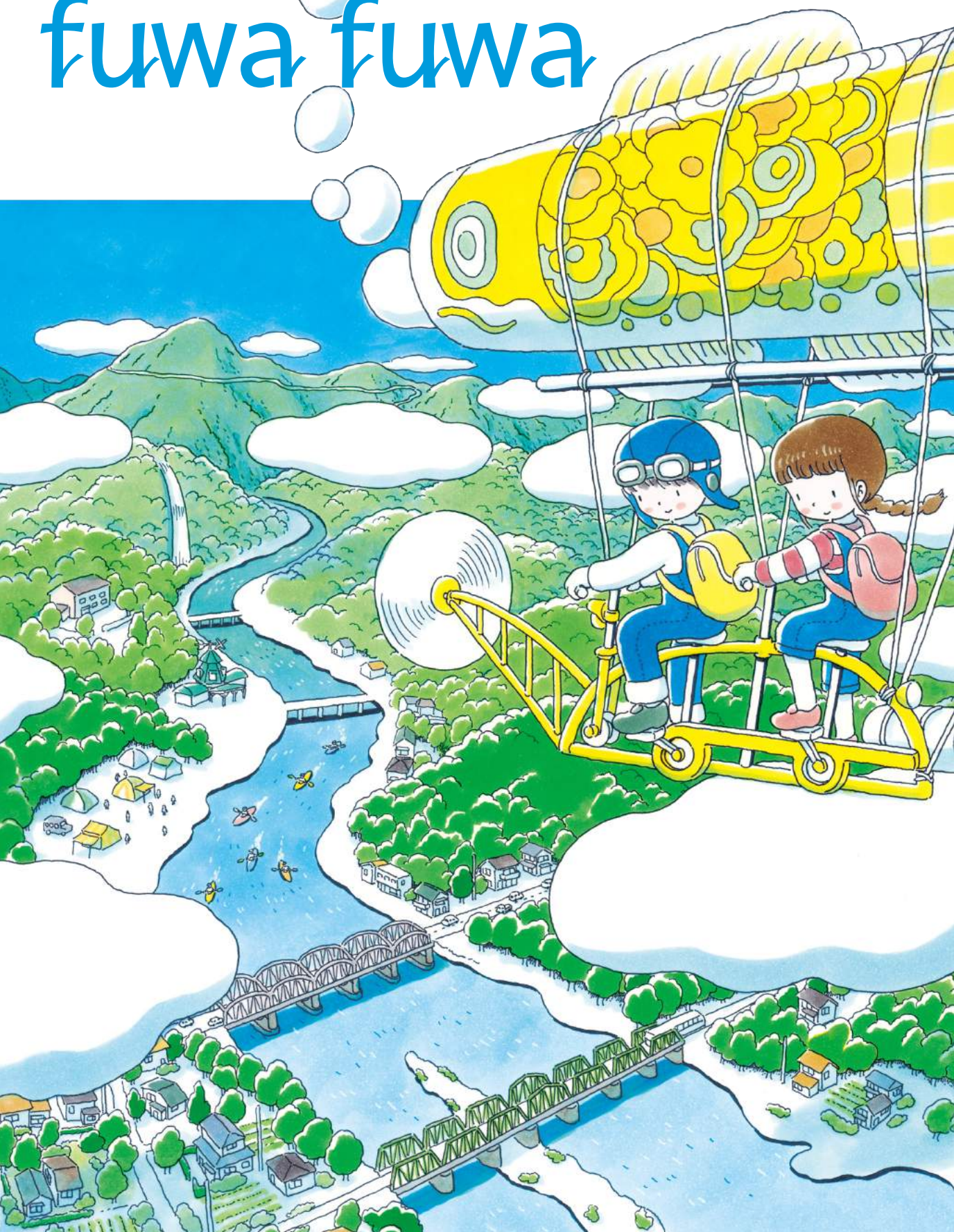

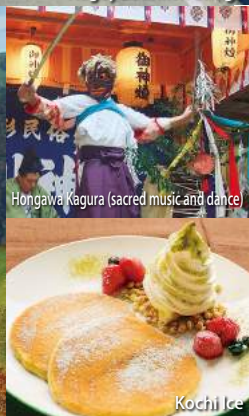

It's a town where Japan's sparkling nature remains in the Nyodo and Yoshino rivers, The Ishizuchi range and national parks.

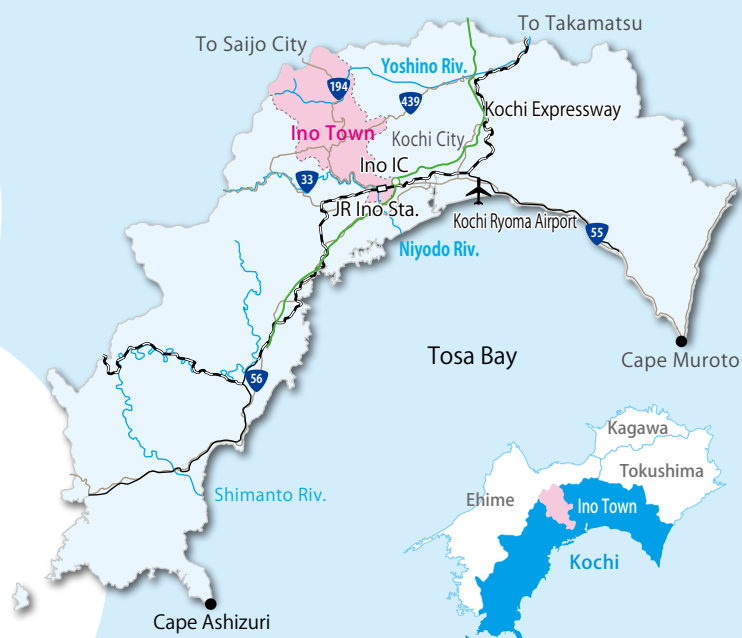

# Ino's fuwa fuwa MAP

Ino Town is located in the center of Kochi Prefecture. The total area is 470.97m<sup>2</sup>, which is about 6.6% of the entire Kochi prefecture. The northern part borders Ehime Prefecture, and since the Shin-Kanpuzan Tunnel linked Kochi City to Saijo City in Ehime Prefecture in 1999, Ino has become the northern entrance to Kochi Prefecture. Route 194 runs from north and south, and intersects with Route 439 crossing Shikoku in the center of Ino.

Tosa's God of Wealth, known as Ino Daikoku-sama. It's a historic shrine founded over 1,200 years ago. It has been said to answer prayers for good commerce, marriage, safety, and family welfare. Grand festivals are held in spring and fall. Many worshippers visit from all over the prefecture, and beyond.

### ② Hongawa Shin Kyodokan Museum

There are many collections and lots of information about Hongawa Kagura, which has around 500 years of history. Many things are displayed, including Kagura masks and tools, paper money, the sound source of the Kagura dance. Also, tools and other items from the Middle ages are on display. Notably, the "burned agriculture" method of farming, which is not practiced anymore.

### ③ Hongawa Kagura on November 15th and other dates

As one of the Tosa's Kaguras, it was designated an Important Intangible Folk Cultural Property in 1980. It's the only Hongawa Kagura in Kochi that performs at night. Most of the dances are aggressive, consisting of 17 programs—including "Yamao no Mai," which uses real swords. In the Hongawa area, the Kabuki performance is dedicated to the shrines from mid-November to early December.

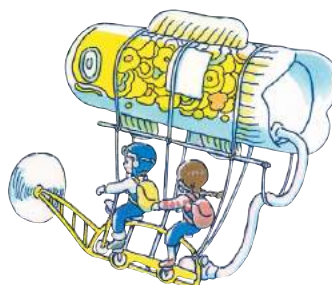

### ③ Captivated by the Niyodo River, Kagura, Sweetfish, and Sake. <Late September>

The annual event many Ino locals look forward to, when they can enjoy sweetfish, local sake, and traditional Kagura in the Niyodo River basin area. The riverside of the Niyodo River is lit up, and the river surface shimmers beautifully.

### ⑥ The Niyodo River International Mizukiri Competition <Late August>
